iv. Give any TWO natural factors and ONE human factor that supported you in identifying the crop in part iii. (3 Marks)

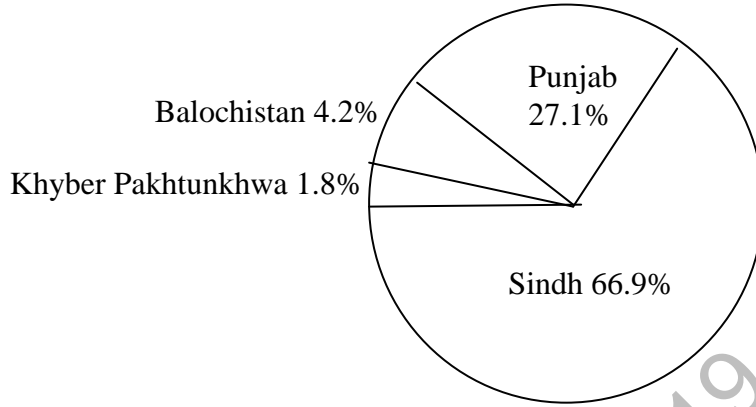
